Dear Mr. Donald:

**RE:    Complex Orange and Green Kleen**

This is in response to your letter of May 29, 2003 concerning submissions made by Dustbane Products seeking acceptance for use of the subject products in Federally Registered Food Establishments.

Based on the information submitted, we can advise that we see no reason to object to the use and composition of the subject products in food plants provided that:

- a)    there will be no contamination of food as a result of their use;
- b)    equipment and surfaces subject to direct contact with food are thoroughly rinsed with potable water after treatment with the products;
- c)    use of the products will not leave any residual fragrance on food contact surfaces and will not mask odours resulting from unsanitary conditions when used in food handling areas; and

- d) re: **Complex Orange**, prior to application (spraying) of the product in food handling areas all foods should either be removed from the vicinity or otherwise protected from the spray.

Please note that our above comments are based on the assumption that the balance of the formulations of these products is water.

The labels of the products are deemed satisfactory for their use in food plants.

We trust that the foregoing will be of use to you.
